Hon. Judge Daniel F. Caruso
Fairfield Probate
District Court, CT

Since 1995, Judge **Daniel F. Caruso** has served as the Judge of Probate for the District of Fairfield while also acting as the interim judge to fill vacancies of significant duration in the New Canaan, Greenwich, and Westport-Weston Districts. He is also the Special Assignment Judge for Fairfield County.

Judge Caruso was raised in Fairfield, and graduated from the University of Connecticut in 1980 with a BA in Political Science. Thereafter, he earned his JD from Vermont Law School in 1983. Also in that year he was admitted to the Connecticut Bar and then to the U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut in 1984. Judge Caruso was elected State Representative for the 134th District in 1989, and served in the Connecticut General Assembly for 6 years before being elected Judge of Probate.

Chairing the Connecticut Siting Council from 2006 to 2011, he approved and oversaw the placement and configuration of the state's critical power and telecommunications infrastructure.

He served two terms as President of the Connecticut Probate Assembly and is a member of the National College of Probate Judges. He has also held various positions in the Town of Fairfield and on numerous civic and charitable boards including: the Kiwanis Club, the Red Cross, the Salvation Army, the Day in the Sun Committee, Caroline House, Center for Women and Families; Notre Dame High School; and the Oak Lawn Cemetery Association. He is an Eagle Scout and a Knight of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem.

Joseph M. Mattone, Sr., is the Chairman of the Board of Mattone Group, LLC, and also a senior partner in the law firm of Mattone, Megna and Todd, a full service Queens-based law firm. He has studied at Columbia University, Practising Law Institute, Adelphi University, St. John's University, and the New School for Social Research in areas related to condemnation, appraisals, valuation, and new zoning codes. Mr. Mattone is currently a member of the New York State Bar Association, the American Bar Association, Queens County Bar Association, and the Columbia Society of Real Estate Appraisers and has recently been elected to the Board of Trustees at St. John's University.

Mr. Mattone has received numerous awards for his philanthropic activities. He was selected as Man of the Year by United Cerebral Palsy, Italian Charities of America, the Flushing Boy's Club, and the Little Neck Douglaston Memorial Day Parade Organization. He was the recipient of the Progress of Peoples Achievement Award from Catholic Charities of Brooklyn and Queens, the Community Leader Honor from the Queens Symphony Orchestra, the Spirit of Service Award from St. John's University, the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Queens Chamber of Commerce, and the Pope John Paul II Distinguished Stewardship Award from the Diocese of Brooklyn. He is a member of the boards of directors for Futures in Education (diocese of Brooklyn) and the Queens Chamber of Commerce, and he has served as the President of the Figli di San Gennaro Festival for the past five years. In May, 2011, Mr. Mattone was honored by the Catholic Lawyers Guild and was also elevated to the Rank of Knight Grand Cross of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem.
